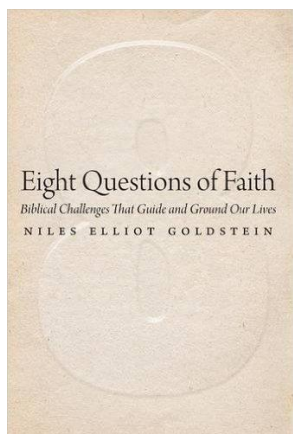


Rabbi Goldstein Returns with New Book

Eight Questions of Faith is a spiritual exploration of some of life's biggest questions—questions that have been asked by prophets and kings, mystics and sinners, and that continue to be asked by every one of us today.

Rabbi Niles Elliot Goldstein uses eight questions found in the Bible to explore the human journey from cradle to grave, confronting such important existential experiences and themes as mortality, responsibility, forbidden knowledge, sin, and the afterlife. By interweaving texts from the Bible, commentaries, philosophy, psychology, and literature with his own experiences, Goldstein also meditates on midlife. This presentation, and his book, will appeal to believers and nonbelievers alike and is aimed at anyone who has ever faced a challenge or wondered what life is all about.



Niles Elliot Goldstein is the director of external relations for the Center for Interfaith Engagement and the founding rabbi of The New Shul in Manhattan's Greenwich Village. He is the award-winning author or editor of 10 books. He lectures widely throughout North America on issues in spirituality and religion and he is on the faculty of Loyola University Chicago.
